The Bendheim Gallery will host an exhibit of contemporary art and installations from June 7 through June 30. This exhibit, titled PROCESS, is conceived by Greenwich Arts Council staff curator Tatiana Mori and will give viewers an exciting insight into the steps the artist went through in creating his or her work.

The projects range from simple works on paper to complex video and large-scale installations. The goal of the exhibit is to give viewers a sense of the artists' struggles, frustrations, and final excitement of creating a work of art.

Eight artists have been chosen to participate in PROCESS. They include Yvonne Boogaerts, whose colorful sculptural installation will be suspended from the ceiling to create a world of light, and fantasy; the visual journals, mounted in plexi glass boxes, of artist Katherine D. Crone; Carla Galler's *Shooting Gallery*, based on the idea of antique carnival shooting games; the video installation of Steve Perkins reflecting the influence of his travels to Thailand; Lucia Ravens' installation, *A Portrait of Peace* explores interpretations of diversity, spirituality, and community; *Five Boroughs*, conceived and created by Donna Ruff using old telephone book pages to represent and document the existence of hundreds of individuals past and present; Gerald Saladyga's *Renovation of Light*, a multi-colored construction highlighting the interaction of bright sunlight and dense shade upon the chromatic spectrum; and Ines Villanueva's artistic search of self-discovery and feminine symbolism. An opening reception for the public, on June 7 from 6 to 8 pm, will follow immediately after the Greenwich Arts Council's Annual Meeting.

All installations and works displayed will be available for sale or commission, and 30% of each gallery purchase is a tax deductible contribution to the Greenwich Arts Council.
