**Greenwich Arts Council's Art to the Avenue
Breaks All Records!**

Art to the Avenue, the Greenwich Arts Council's annual celebration of the arts, has come to a close, and although sales are continuing, Greenwich Avenue is slowly losing its spring nomenclature as a "strolling gallery."

This was the 10th anniversary of Art to the Avenue and the Greenwich Arts Council is proud to announce that so far sales for this year's event have topped \$96,000, breaking all previous records. With participating artists representing well over 50 different cities and towns in the tri-state region, over 40 artists sold works.

The Greenwich Arts Council thanks all the participating artists, retailers, sponsors, workshop instructors, performers, volunteers, and staff who contributed to the success of the 10th anniversary of Art to the Avenue.
