Gallery Talk with David & Max Dunlop
Featuring Works
Currently on Display at The Bendheim Gallery

Representing the Flow of Art Gallery in Norwalk, the current exhibit at Greenwich Arts Council's Bendheim Gallery features paintings by father and son artists, David and Max Dunlop. On Friday evening, July 11, both artists will be on hand to offer a short lecture and informal gallery talk/tour of the current exhibit.

David Dunlop, who is widely known for his landscape paintings, states, "I get inspired by almost anything you can see - from a sewer pipe with its effluents to a bouquet of flowers." A Fairfield County resident, he has had an extensive career as painter and teacher, winning many awards for his works in oil, watercolor, pastel, and monotype. He has been on the faculty of the Silvermine School of Art in New Canaan since 1993 and served on the Board of the Silvermine Guild Art Center from 1991 to 2004.

Twenty-one-year-old Max Dunlop has enjoyed using his father's art supplies since childhood. Holder of a Bachelor of Fine Arts from the Art Institute of Boston, he paints mainly on aluminum, steel, and copper - materials he took up after observing his father's experiments with them. He is also an accomplished percussionist.

An unusual feature of this exhibition will be paintings produced jointly the Dunlops. They have adopted a procedure where they work concurrently, each starting 50 percent of their joint works. When either one of them is ready to switch, they trade paintings, at which point each is free to modify or completely transform the work he takes over. As they put it, they thus produce "completely collaborative works," while "respecting the creative autonomy of each artist."

The lecture and tour will be free to the public on a first-come, first-served basis. The time is 7 pm on Friday, July 11. The lecture will be in the GAC Meeting Room with the gallery tour to follow immediately after.
